### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Senate Bill 405 (SB 405) proposes to provide state funding for the expansion of psychiatric beds in hospitals in both Eau Claire County and Chippewa County, in the amount of \$15,000,000. Under 2019 Wisconsin Act 9 (Act 9), the Governor's partial veto eliminated provisions under s. 20.866(2)(zcx), Wis. Stats., to award grants for the establishment of the Northern Wisconsin Regional Crisis Center (NWRCC), with the state building commission authorizing up to \$15,000,000 for this non-state purpose. The veto removed the provision requiring that the state building commission could not award a grant under s. 20.866(2)(zcx), Wis. Stats., unless the project is in and for the public interest and purpose, and it affected the direction of the \$15,000,000 to support the expansion of a center instead of NWRCC. The awarding of grants was also struck, leaving only the provision that the Building Commission may authorize up to \$15,000,000 in general fund supported borrowing for projects under s. 13.48 (20s), Wis. Stats.

Under SB 405, the building commission is directed to authorize a grant in that amount and request the building commission to authorize general fund supported borrowing, if necessary. SB 405 provides preference in psychiatric admissions to those who meet the criteria for emergency detention under s. 51.15 Wis. Stats., and resides within one the specified counties in the Northwestern region of the State. SB 405 also creates an exemption to the State's moratorium on new hospital beds (currently capped at 22,516), allowing hospitals to add more beds if the beds are reserved for psychiatric patients.

If the grant that is awarded is for any reason not used for the purpose of expanding psychiatric bed capacity, the state would be required to retain an ownership interest in the hospital's expansion equivalent to the amount of the grant award.

The Department of Administration's (Department) Capital Finance Office within the Division of Executive Budget and Finance (DEBF) is responsible for providing debt management of general obligations, revenue obligations, and appropriation obligations issued by the State. As such, DEBF would be responsible for the contracting of the public debt proposed under SB 405, for ensuring that the loan repayment and management was statutorily compliant, and that it adhered to the Post Issuance Bond Compliance Policy and its identified federal tax requirements. The Division of Facilities Development and Management (DFDM) is responsible for establishing capital projects from which proceeds are disbursed. DFDM would be responsible for establishing a capital project for the grant proceeds and general fund supported borrowing, if necessary.

The amount of Departmental staff time required is indeterminate, however, the Department anticipates that the work would be able to be absorbed within existing staffing levels.
