Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a \$5,000 surcharge to be imposed on persons who are convicted of patronizing or soliciting prostitutes, pandering, or keeping a place of prostitution. Under this bill, the surcharge amounts collected are used for treatment and services for sex-trafficking victims and for criminal investigative operations and law enforcement related to Internet crimes against children.

As of 12/31/18, the Department of Corrections (DOC) had 50 inmates in an adult institution under the statutes impacted by this bill. As of the same date, there were 49 offenders on extended supervision or probation.

DOC estimates that there will be no fiscal impact as a result of this bill. This bill does not impact the number of people sentenced for prostitution offenses nor the sentencing practices of judges. Additionally, DOC's existing staff would be able to collect the prostitution surcharge for inmates or offenders that have outstanding balances during their period of DOC custody or supervision.
