## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law homeschooled pupils are allowed to participate in his/her resident school district's extracurricular and interscholastic athletic activities, though this does not currently extend to pupils attending virtual charter schools. Like that of the homeschooled pupils, those who are participating in extracurricular activities and/or interscholastic athletics may be charged the same participation fee as those enrolled in the school district.

This proposed bill would allow a pupil who attends a virtual charter school to participate in activities at the resident school district that the pupil would otherwise not be able to participate. This further requires that school districts that are members of an interscholastic athletic association must allow virtual charter school pupils and homeschooled pupils to participate in order to maintain membership.

The provisions of the bill would not impact how pupils are counted for revenue limits or for state aid. While the resident school district could still charge fees for extracurricular and interscholastic athletic activities to a pupil who is enrolled in a virtual charter school in a different district (through open enrollment), those fees may be less than the actual marginal cost of the pupil involvement. This could potentially result in a financial burden on the local residential school district, though the amount is indeterminate.

In summary, this bill would allow pupils to participate in extracurricular and interscholastic athletic activities and have the pupil pay the school district fees for the activities, though the fees may not be adequate to cover the additional marginal costs associated with additional participants.
