Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2019 SB 709 creates the Office of Water Policy that would be attached to the University of Wisconsin System (UWS). The Department of Workforce Development (DWD) is listed as one of four state agencies with which the Office of Water Policy must coordinate to perform its duties under the bill.

The Department would work with the Director of the Office of Water Policy to analyze demand for public and private sector job opportunities in water quality. This information would be included in a report prepared by the director, and provided to the UW System Board of Regents no later than December 31, 2021.

For purposes of this fiscal estimate, DWD assumes that the activities of soliciting private sector employers to gather data on prospective job opportunities and activities of analyzing undergraduate and graduate water programs will be performed by the Director of the Office of Water Policy and not DWD.

Under this bill, the Department estimates a one-time effort of 30 work hours to provide administrative support and technical assistance to the Office of Water Policy. This is a one-time cost of less than \$2,000 to the Department and can be absorbed.
