## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2019 SB 709 creates an Office of Water Policy, which is attached to the University of Wisconsin System, to coordinate various efforts surrounding the state's water resources. Among other things, the bill requires the Office of Water Policy to create a public dashboard with information on municipal water quality reports, private well data and surface water quality using data from various state agencies and other credible organizations. The bill also requires the Office of Water Policy to facilitate information sharing between state agencies, University of Wisconsin System campuses and other stakeholders. In addition, 2019 SB 709 requires the Office of Water Policy to perform a feasibility assessment of statewide programs to promote water efficiency and conservation and improve water quality.

2019 SB 709 would require Public Service Commission staff time to compile data, participate in meetings, and conduct other activities requested by the Office of Water Policy. These activities would support the Office of Water Policy's publicly accessible dashboard, the fulfillment of its requirements related to the Blue Accounting initiative of the Great Lakes Commission, and the development of a feasibility assessment for statewide water conservation and efficiency and water quality improvement programs included in the proposed legislation. These tasks can be absorbed by existing Commission staff resources.
