## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill would provide funding and positions for the provisions in 2019 Senate Bill 772, relating to perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) regulation.

The bill would provide \$250,000 as a onetime appropriation from the environmental fund for the UW System to provide a grant to a campus to research technologies for destroying PFAS. A new appropriation would be created for this purpose.

The bill would also provide other funding and provisions to other agencies related to 2019 Senate Bill 772.

## Long-Range Fiscal Implications
