2019 Senate Bill 328

Senate Amendment 1

2019 Senate Bill 328 modifies inspection requirements for recreational and educational camps, which are licensed by the Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) or a local health department acting as DATCP's agent. Recreational and educational camp licenses must be renewed annually, and the camps are also currently subject to annual inspections by DATCP or the local health department.

2019 SENATE BILL 328

The bill requires DATCP or the local health department to waive, for two out of every three license years, any inspection that is required for license renewal as a recreational or educational camp, if the camp has received accreditation from the American Camp Association for those years.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

The amendment replaces the language of the bill and instead states that DATCP or the local health department may waive, for not more than two out of every three license years, any routine inspection for those license years if the camp has exhibited effective managerial control of public health hazards, as defined by DATCP by rule.

BILL HISTORY

Senator Bernier offered Senate Amendment 1 on October 14, 2019. On January 15, 2020, the Senate Committee on Public Benefits, Licensing, and State-Federal Relations unanimously recommended adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended.
