SENATE BILL 6

February 5, 2020 – Introduced by COMMITTEE ON SENATE ORGANIZATION, by request of Governor Tony Evers. Referred to Committee on Agriculture, Revenue and Financial Institutions.

1 **AN ACT to create** 20.115 (3) (d) and 93.42 (6) of the statutes; **relating to:** the
2 Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports and making an appropriation.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill provides \$1,000,000 to the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection to develop a Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports, which would work with the dairy industry to increase dairy exports to 20 percent of the United States' milk supply by 2024, and authorizes two positions in DATCP to implement the program.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert

SECTION 2. 20.115 (3) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

20.115 (3) (d) *Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports*. As a continuing appropriation, the amounts in the schedule for the center for international agribusiness marketing under s. 93.42 to develop a Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports to work with the dairy industry to increase dairy exports to 20 percent of the United States' milk supply by 2024.

SECTION 3. 93.42 (6) of the statutes is created to read:

93.42 (6) Creating a Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports to work with the dairy industry to increase dairy exports to 20 percent of the United States' milk supply by 2024.

SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provisions.

(1) POSITION AUTHORIZATIONS. The authorized FTE positions for the department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection are increased by 2.0 GPR positions, to be funded from the appropriation under s. 20.115 (3) (d), for implementing the Wisconsin Initiative for Dairy Exports under s. 93.42 (6).
