Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill allows DCF to set the eligibility and amounts for a grant program to child care providers in need of additional support for children with disabilities. The fiscal impact is unknown due to the undetermined eligibility criteria and the undetermined sufficiency of other funding for this purpose. The new appropriation, 20.437(1) (em) is sum-sufficient and provides funding as determined by the Department, in the case that staffing needs at child care centers and providers and grant eligibility criteria are established.

There may be costs associated with developing the grant program, such as IT, systems, staffing and training costs, however the state fiscal effect of those costs are indeterminate since the grant program has not yet been designed. The child care administrative budget is capped by the biennial budget allocation in s.49.175 (q) and the may not be able to absorb these unknown changes.
