Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would require the Department of Corrections (DOC), no later than July 1, 2022, to develop and maintain a publicly available dashboard on its Internet site, or on an Internet site maintained by the Department of Administration. The dashboard would report on DOC's performance of its core functions, and would be required to be updated on a quarterly basis.

The performance metrics would need to include the performance metrics used by DOC in the dashboard that the Department created under 2016 Executive Order No. 189.

It is anticipated that the Department would be able to recreate the aforementioned dashboard with existing resources. Therefore there would be no state fiscal impact from this proposed legislation.
