Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2021 Assembly Bill 422 would create a new, continuing GPR appropriation under s. 20.380 (3) (dm), Wis. Stats., Rural creative economy grant program, for a competitive grant program to be administered by the Wisconsin Arts Board in the Department of Tourism. \$250,000 GPR would be appropriated annually for the grant program.

The program would be created under a newly created appropriation s. 41.567, Wis. Stats., which defines eligible applicants as businesses, municipal and county governments, business development organizations and other creative associations located in a city, town, or village with a population of less than 20,000 and not defined by the U.S. Census Bureau as an urbanized area. An individual grant may not exceed \$40,000 and must help to foster job and business creation, training and development, community engagement, or creative products or services. Recipients must have secured funding from nonstate sources in an amount equal to the proposed grant amount in order to be eligible.

In addition to the administration of the program, the Wisconsin Arts Board must produce a report on the effectiveness of the grant program to be submitted to the Joint Committee on Finance no later than May 1, 2023.

The Wisconsin Arts Board expects that the additional workload of administering the program is absorbable under current expenditure authority and staffing levels. Minimal one-time costs related to marketing the program, updating relevant materials, and developing program guidelines are also anticipated to be absorbable within current staffing levels and expenditure authority.

An increase in financial management support would also be required from the Department of Administration's Division of Enterprise Operations (DEO); the Department provides administrative and financial support to the Arts Board. Ongoing DEO personnel resources would be required, such as for: assisting the Arts Board in meeting reporting requirements, managing expenditures, monitoring audits, and the handling of any lock-box information. DEO anticipates it would be able to absorb the workload within current staffing levels and expenditure authority.
