Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill raises the state minimum wage, for most employees, initially to \$10.15 per hour and to \$15.00 per hour one year after the effective date of the bill. Beginning two years after the effective date, the bill requires the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to revise the minimum wage annually based on a formula involving the consumer price index (CPI) when the CPI has increased over the year before the preceding year. DWD is also required to publish the revised minimum wage in the Wisconsin Administrative Register and on the department's internet site.

The bill repeals provisions for: establishing lower minimum wages for tipped employees; a provision requiring DWD to promulgate rules governing the counting of tips or similar gratuities toward the payment of minimum wage; setting specific meal and lodging allowances; and setting minimum wages for minor, opportunity, or agricultural and other employees. DWD is required to establish the minimum wage for those employees by rule.

Finally, the bill eliminates the prohibition for a city, village, town or county from enacting and administering an ordinance establishing a minimum wage.

The department estimates this legislation would generate an additional 200 wage related complaints annually that cannot be fielded, investigated, or resolved with current authorized position levels. To address this increase, DWD's Equal Rights Division would incur contractor related costs equal to one Full Time Equivalent Equal Rights Officer which has an annual total cost of \$88,300. The bill does not provide resources or position authority for these duties. The cost is not absorbable within the ER Division's staffing resources.

There would be one-time absorbable charges of \$3,500 for staffing set-up and \$6,000 to review, revise, and reprint existing publications.

Local government counterparts to the ERD may experience an increase in wage related complaints which may necessitate additional staff. Local governments may also need to update documentation and publications including official documents and may choose to explore options for development and implementation of local ordinances. These costs are currently indeterminate.
