Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits discrimination against any individual in the receipt of an anatomical gift or related services solely on the basis of the individual's disability. The bill permits a hospital to consider an individual's disability in making treatment or coverage recommendations or decisions, but only if a physician finds that the disability is medically significant to the receipt of the anatomical gift following an individualized evaluation of the individual.

The bill also prohibits discrimination against receiving a transplant provided the individual has the necessary support system to assist the individual in complying with the posttransplantation medical requirements. Under the bill, an individual may bring an action in circuit court for a violation of the bill, and requires the court to hold a hearing within 30 days of the filing of the action. In an action before the circuit court, the court may grant injunctive or equitable relief, including ordering necessary auxiliary aids and services.

To implement the bill, the Wisconsin Court System may need to create new history event codes and possibly a new class code in the WCCA system, as well as develop new model recordkeeping procedures for court system employees. The Court System estimates the time to complete this process to be between 3 and 6 months.

In addition, because of the requirement for speedy trial, these actions will take time currently reserved for similar speedy proceedings.
