## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits certain felony offenders from possessing, controlling, or residing with a vicious dog, as determined by a humane officer or a law enforcement officer using criteria specified in the bill. A person who violates the prohibition is subject to penalty or imprisonment, depending on the circumstances that led to the lack of control of the dog and any outcome to humans.

Exemptions are provided under the bill if the dog is needed to earn a livelihood or as a condition of employment and will not endanger public safety. A person seeking an exemption must file a motion in the circuit court for the county in which he or she will possess, control, or reside with the vicious dog, and also file with local district attorney, who is required to contact local law enforcement agencies to inform them of the request and to solicit any information that may be relevant to whether the request should be granted.

Because the court is required to put the defendant on notice of the requirements of this new law and penalty, court staff and judges would need to be trained on this law and its requirements. This would not be time-consuming for the court, so there would be no significant fiscal impact.
