<b>Description</b> requiring school boards to report information regarding credit recovery courses					

### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires a school board annually to report to the Department the number of pupils who attended a credit recovery course during the school year and, for each pupil, the pupil's grade level and the subject of the recovery course the pupil attended. DPI must annually compile and submit that information to the appropriate standing committees of the legislature. This reporting requirement first applies to information reported for the 2022-23 school year.

#### Local: Indeterminate

This bill creates an additional reporting requirement for school districts. Generally, the impact of this bill may result in some increased staff time for school districts to collect and report this data to DPI, but how that would translate into a fiscal impact is unknown (indeterminate).

#### State: Indeterminate

The Department would need to allocate staff resources (time) to make the necessary changes to the state's student information system (SIS) in order to facilitate collection of the required data on credit recovery courses, as well as to provide technical assistance to local education agencies (LEAs), and to assemble the data into a report to the legislature. It is unknown how much staff time/costs that would require. Because the bill does not provide additional funding for administrative costs, the Department would have to reallocate resources and absorb any additional administrative costs.

### Long-Range Fiscal Implications
