## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Current law [§. 84.01 (35), Wis. Stats] requires the Department to give "due consideration" to including bikeways and pedestrian facilities in new construction and reconstruction highway projects funding with state or federal funds under §20.395 or §20.866. The proposed bill changes the language to "ensure that" these facilities "are established". In addition, it confers rule-making authority to the Department to identify exceptions to the requirement but identifies specific criteria the exceptions must meet. These changes return existing statutory language to what was law, prior to the changes made in 2015 Wisconsin Act 55.

The language change from "due consideration" to "ensure that" these facilities "are established" does not significantly change the Department's current practice for new highway construction and reconstruction. Therefore, it is not anticipated the bill will have a significant fiscal impact on the State's highway program.

## **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

It is not anticipated this bill will have a significant long-term fiscal impact.
