### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill does the following related to the practice of private security persons:

1. Requires a private security person or private detective who holds a license to carry a concealed weapon to obtain a certificate from the Department of Safety and Professional Services to carry a weapon while on duty.
2. Specifies that a city, village, town, or county may enact and enforce ordinances prohibiting persons from acting as a private security person without a permit granted by DSPS and from employing or contracting with an individual to act as a private security person without a DSPS permit. Current law generally requires a person to obtain a permit granted by DSPS to act as a private security person.
3. Requires local law enforcement personnel to report to DSPS alleged violations of the private security person, private detective, and private detective agency laws.
4. Prohibits a person from submitting to DSPS an application for a private security person permits on behalf of another individual. The bill also allows an individual's employer to reimburse the individual for the initial permit fee charged by DSPS and requires an individual to whom a permit is granted to notify the individual's employer.
5. Requires DSPS to submit an annual report to the legislature that includes information on complaints received related to private security persons, private detectives, and private detective agencies and DSPS's responses to those complaints.

The Department estimates that it will incur one-time costs totaling \$5,500 for staff salary, fringe, and overhead to review, update and communicate rules, modify forms and websites, and establish procedures regarding the required certificate. The Department additionally estimates annual costs of \$8,600 for salary, fringe and staff overhead to review for collecting, analyzing, and taking action on alleged violations. The total cost to implement this bill is \$14,100 that cannot be absorbed within the DSPS budget.
