Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This proposal would codify the responsibilities of the Office of the Inspector General (OIG) of the Department of Health Services (DHS) in state statute. The bill would also require DHS to work with the Department of Administration to create a report on public benefit programs.

With the assumption that the bill is intended to encompass the current mission of the OIG, the bill does not by itself increase workload or costs for the office. As this mission scope would now be a statutory requirement, it is possible the office may need additional resources in the future to continue fulfilling the mission as federal and state program requirements evolve over time.

In order to meet the needs of the Department of Administration in preparing a biennial report on public benefit programs, DHS will need to hire contract staff for several months every other year. The cost of these contractors is estimated at \$200,000 all funds (\$100,000 GPR and \$100,000 FED) in the second year of each biennium.
