Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill combines the child psychiatry consultation program (CPCP) with additional services into a new mental health consultation program. The current CPCP assists clinicians in providing care to children with mental health needs. Current statutes require the Department to develop a comprehensive mental health consultation program for children through a series of regional hubs. The proposed legislation removes this requirement for the separate CPCP and instead creates a statewide mental health consultation program which provides services for adults and children. The bill appropriates \$2 million GPR annually for the program.

The Department estimates that it would require an increase of 3.0 FTE GPR to administer the new statewide program encompassing services for both children and adults, with a larger budget. The new positions would include 2.0 FTE Public Health Nurses with clinical background who would focus their efforts on the 5 public health regions and provide technical assistance to providers and 1.0 FTE epidemiologist to focus on collecting, analyzing, and reporting data for the program. These staff, along with other program costs such as travel are estimated to total \$412,000 GPR Annually. In sum, the annual fiscal effect of the bill is \$2,412,000 GPR and 3.0 FTE
