Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2021 SB 1086 requires the Public Service Commission (Commission) to determine that reclaimed nonmetallic mining sites are used to the extent practicable before issuing a certificate of public conveniences and necessity (CPCN) or a certificate of authority (CA) for solar projects. The work associated with this bill can be absorbed by existing Commission staff. There would be no fiscal effects to the Commission as a result of this bill.
