Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Currently, if a board of fire and police commissioners of a first class city discharges, suspends, or reduces in rank an officer or member of the police or fire department, the disciplined person may appeal that decision to a circuit court. This bill specifies the scope of review under which a court is to review an appeal of this sort.

Under the bill, a court must review the evidence independently and without deference to the board's findings. The bill changes the scope of review and findings the court must make.

Fiscal Effect – Costs/Savings: The Director of State Courts has determined that the implementation of this bill would have no fiscal effect for the courts.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The Court does not anticipate a fiscal impact resulting from the proposed bill.
