Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, within 24 hours after the end of the day on which a juvenile is taken into custody under the Juvenile Justice Code, the juvenile court must hold a hearing to determine whether to continue to hold the juvenile in custody. Under current law, the 24-hour period excludes Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays.

Under this bill, a day that the clerk of court's office is closed is also excluded, if the closure is due to inclement weather or another unforeseen emergency

District Attorney offices do not anticipate a significant fiscal effect on their offices resulting from this proposed bill. There may be some local savings due to not having to hold and staff juvenile proceedings on days the courthouse would otherwise be closed.
