## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill eliminates current law residency requirements and allows parties, resident or nonresident, to obtain a marriage license in any county of the state; extends the period for which a marriage license is valid from 30 days to 60 days; and reduces the waiting period for a marriage license from five days to three days.

This bill has no state fiscal effect. The fiscal effect on counties is indeterminate. County clerks may incur costs in the revision of procedures for processing marriage licenses and as a result of the modifications in the timelines for issuing and processing licenses.
