Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill prohibits discrimination on the basis of vaccination status, which is defined in the bill as whether an individual has received one or more doses of a vaccine. The bill changes several anti-discrimination laws that broadly affect DCF and its subcontractors and subrecipients (including counties and tribes), while also specifically creating §48.82 (7) to prohibit the discrimination against an otherwise qualified person in the adoption of minor children due to the person's vaccination status.

DCF does not identify any agency-wide or adoption program-specific costs related to the changes under the bill, however the fiscal estimate is indeterminate due to the non-specific definition of "vaccine status" (not COVID-19 specific) under the bill. There are potential long-term consequences and potential conflicts with s. 252.04 (state immunization program), which provides under s. 252.04(5)(b)(1) that a child care center may exclude any student who fails to satisfy immunization requirements under s. 252.04(2).
