Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, courts are required to appoint a GAL for a minor child in a proceeding to grant reasonable visitation rights to a non-parent. There is no state fiscal effect for DCF under this bill, as it applies only to proceedings under chapter 767. However, family court costs may increase in the amount of new and additional services required and provided under this bill.
