Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The proposed legislation would enable a child or spouse of a relocated active duty service member to qualify for resident tuition at a Wisconsin technical college who meet the following criteria:

- The person is the child or spouse of an active duty member of the US armed forces and the person has been accepted for admission to a district school.
- The service member resided in Wisconsin at the time the person was accepted for admission to a district school but the service member was subsequently relocated and stationed in another state.
- After the person's admission and initial enrollment in a district school, the person has remained continuously enrolled in the district school.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

If the proposed legislation was enacted, the Wisconsin Technical College System districts would see a small reduction in tuition revenue.
