Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill allows certain persons who have recently served as an army medic, a navy or coast guard corpsman, or an air force aerospace medical technician in the U.S. armed forces to practice certain skilled health services as part of a program facilitated by the Department of Safety and Professional Services without having to obtain a license. This bill directs DSPPS, in collaboration with the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Medical Examining Board, and the Board of Nursing, to establish a program in which military medical personnel may temporarily practice certain skilled health services. The collaboration for DVA would be providing information to DSPPS on eligible veterans. This bill could require additional responsibilities for DVA staff but should not increase costs to the Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA).
