Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires law enforcement to submit a sexual assault kit to the Department of Justice Wisconsin State Crime Laboratories for processing, if the victim has consented to analysis, or to securely store the kit for a period of 10 years if the victim has not consented to analysis. Once the kit has been processed, the State Crime Laboratories are required to send it to the submitting law enforcement agency for the longer of a period of 50 years, or until the expiration of the statute of limitations, or until the end of the term of imprisonment or probation for a person convicted in the case.

The bill requires the Department of Justice to promulgate administrative rules to administer this provision.

The Department is further required to collect information on the number and nature of offenses committed in the state related to the sexual assault kits, and to publish data at least annually on law enforcement agency compliance with sexual assault kit reporting requirement.

The State Crime Laboratories have existing capacity to store a maximum of 3,200 sexual assault kits. It is not known whether this bill will increase the number of sexual assault kits that are received and stored each year. At current submission rates, the State Crime Laboratory may exceed storage capacity before the kits have reached the 10 year period. Between the implementation of the existing storage freezer in 2016 and 2020, the laboratories have stored 1,603 kits and have received an average of 370 kits per year over the last three years.

At this rate of receipt, the laboratories will need to increase freezer storage space in 2024 when the oldest kits will have been stored between 8-9 years. Adding freezer space to comply with the ten-year storage period will cost approximately \$100,000 in one-time costs and \$25,000 annually in additional rent and temperature monitoring.

The State Crime Laboratories are implementing a laboratory information management system that will include capacity for tracking sexual assault kits. The need for or cost of modifying the system to collect and report additional information from law enforcement agencies is not known but can likely be absorbed within existing resources.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Increasing Crime Laboratory storage capacity will cost \$100,000 in one-time costs in 2024 and \$25,000 annually thereafter.
