Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2021 SB 757 makes several changes to the Focus on Energy programs to include programs that promote energy efficiency and renewable energy measures for low-income households. The bill also creates a statutory provision that requires the Commission to work with the weatherization program at the Department of Administration to accomplish this and to ensure that at least twenty five percent of Focus on Energy funds are devoted to these programs. The work associated with these statutory changes to the Focus on Energy program can be absorbed with existing staff resources. There would be no fiscal effects to the Commission as a result of this bill.
