2021 Assembly Bill 624

Assembly Amendment 1

2021 ASSEMBLY BILL 624

The bill repeals and recreates subch. III, ch. 4, Stats., to establish new legislative districts in this state based on the results of the 2020 federal decennial census.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 makes a change to the description of the thirty-ninth Assembly district. The description of the district in the bill, as introduced, includes a reference to the Village of Kekoskee but not the Town of Williamstown. Previously, they had entered into a merger agreement; however, the merger was reversed in state court. Therefore, the town must be listed separately to be included in the district. Assembly Amendment 1 accomplishes this by listing the town separately in the description of the thirty-ninth Assembly district.

BILL HISTORY

The bill was introduced by Representative Vos and Senator LeMahieu on October 21, 2021. A public hearing was held on October 28, 2021, by the Assembly Committee on State Affairs and the Senate Committee on Government Operations, Legal Review and Consumer Protection. On November 2, 2021, Representative Swearingen offered the amendment. On November 8, 2021, the Assembly Committee recommended adoption of the amendment, on a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 1; and passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 8; Noes, 4.
