Senate Amendment 1

## 2021 SENATE BILL 100

Under current law, in general, it is a Class A misdemeanor for a person to intentionally cause bodily harm<sup>1</sup> (battery) to a person. However, it is a Class H felony for a person to commit battery against a probation, extended supervision, parole,<sup>2</sup> community supervision,<sup>3</sup> or aftercare<sup>4</sup> agent (agent). The penalty for a Class A misdemeanor is a fine of up to \$10,000, imprisonment of up to nine months, or both. The penalty for a Class H felony is a fine of up to \$10,000, imprisonment of up to six years, or both.

Senate Bill 100 provides that it is a Class H felony to commit, or threaten to commit, battery against an agent or the family member<sup>5</sup> of an agent. The bill also amends the definitions of "aftercare agent" and "community supervision agent" to include persons authorized by federally recognized American Indian tribes or bands to exercise control over a juvenile on aftercare or a comparable program that is authorized by the tribe or band.

## SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Amendment 1 defines "exercise control" to include exercising control either directly or through a subordinate, and includes transporting the person supervised.

## **BILL HISTORY**

Senator Jacque offered Senate Amendment 1 on April 7, 2021. On May 6, 2021, the Senate Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety voted to recommend adoption of Senate Amendment 1 and passage of Senate Bill 100, as amended, both on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 2.
