2021 Senate Bill 1004

Senate Amendment 1

2021 SENATE BILL 1004

Current law requires the State Superintendent to grant a substitute teacher permit to a person who has an associate degree, completes substitute teacher training, and passes a background check.

Senate Bill 1004 also requires the State Superintendent to grant a substitute teacher permit to a person who is currently in a teacher training program, if the individual meets certain requirements. A person may receive a substitute teacher permit if he or she is at least 21 years old, is enrolled in a teacher preparatory program, has achieved junior level status, has completed 15 hours of classroom observation, and passes a background check.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Amendment 1 changes the age requirement from 21 years of age to 20 years of age.

BILL HISTORY

Senator Darling offered Senate Amendment 1 to Senate Bill 1004 on March 1, 2022. On March 4, 2022, the Senate Committee on Education voted to recommend adoption of Senate Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 4; Noes, 3. The committee then voted to recommend passage of Senate Bill 1004, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 4; Noes, 3.
