## **2021 SENATE BILL 124**

February 18, 2021 - Introduced by Senators Wanggaard, L. Taylor, Darling and Cowles, cosponsored by Representatives Spiros, Armstrong, Brandtjen and Ortiz-Velez. Referred to Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

AN ACT to create 20.455 (2) (cp) and 165.989 of the statutes; relating to:

community-oriented policing-house grant program and making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill establishes a \$600,000 grant program, administered by the Department of Justice, for cities with a population of 60,000 or more to fund community-oriented policing-house programs.
