## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

SWIB adopted a Generative Artificial Intelligence (AI) Tool Usage Policy in October 2023. The policy outlines best practices for use of AI tools in the workplace, especially as it pertains to using confidential, sensitive, or proprietary information. AI tools have the potential to automate tasks, improve decision-making, and provide valuable insights into SWIB's operations. However, the use of AI tools also presents new challenges in terms of information security and data protection.

SWIB is an independent state agency and its Board of Trustees annually reviews the number of positions necessary to carry out SWIB's fiduciary duties to the trust funds it manages.
