Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) to design a poster in consultation with the Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs (DVA) that provides information with respect to benefits and services available to veterans.

At a minimum, the poster shall include the following:

1. Contact information and the website for DVA and information about programs available through DVA,
2. Contact information and the website for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs,
3. The phone number for the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs crisis line,
4. Information regarding substance use disorder and mental health treatment services,
5. Educational, employment, and training resources,
6. Tax benefit availability,
7. Drivers' licenses and identification cards specifically for veterans, and
8. Unemployment insurance benefits.

The bill requires the poster be written in English, Spanish, and Hmong. It also requires that the poster is posted on DWD's website for employers to print.

This bill requires employers to display the poster in one or more conspicuous places where notices to employees are usually posted. DWD's Equal Rights Division (ERD) will provide oversight of the employer display of posters.

The DWD-related requirements to design a poster with DVA and have the poster available on DWD's website in multiple languages, is estimated to have a one-time fiscal impact to the department of less than \$1,000. Department staff regularly coordinate with DVA staff and the required information for the poster is currently known and available. DWD estimates staff effort to design and receive approval for the poster content will take 15 hours or less, which is less than \$1,000 in one-time costs and is absorbable.

DWD assumes ongoing oversight of the bill's employer posting requirement will have no annual fiscal impact because it will be incorporated into existing posting oversight activities without material additional workload.
