Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under the Assembly Bill (AB-69), the governor is required to allocate money received by the state under the federal American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) to the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to reimburse school boards and operators of charter schools for costs associated with employing or contracting for armed school resource officers.

The U.S. Department of the Treasury (Treasury) issued a Final Rule (FR) to implement the Coronavirus State Local and Fiscal Recovery Fund (SLFRF) under section 602 of the Social Security Act, as amended by ARPA. Under the FR, Treasury outlines the scope of eligible uses for SLFRF funding, which under ARPA include supporting public health expenditures; addressing negative economic impacts caused by the public health emergency; replacing lost public sector revenue; providing premium pay for essential workers; and investing in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure. The State's Recovery Fund amount under the program is \$2,533,160,626,50 from which the State has and will expend, and for which all funds have been reported as allocated.

Per Treasury's FR for SLFRF, recipients must obligate all funds by December 31, 2024, and expend funds by December 31, 2026. The obligation deadline under ARPA is prior to the required reimbursements as they are outlined under the bill for the 2024-25 and 2025-26 school years, as fifty and twenty-five percent of costs for armed school resource officers, respectively.

Therefore, no amount is available for allocation for AB-69's specified reimbursements, nor are reimbursements permitted per Treasury's FR for part of one and the entirety of another of the three school years identified in the bill.
