Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 86 prohibits Wisconsin Technical Colleges and University of Wisconsin institutions from reducing gift aid that the college or institution has offered to a student because the student has received a private scholarship, except under the following conditions:

- A technical college may reduce the amount of a student's offered gift aid in order to comply with the National Junior College Athletic Association's individual or team financial restrictions.
- The college reduce the amount of the student's total gift aid if the total aid from all sources exceeds the student's financial need.
- The technical college may further reduce a student's offered gift aid if the college receives approval to do so from the organization that awarded the private scholarship that triggered the student's total gift aid exceeding the student's financial need.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The proposed legislation would not have a fiscal impact on the Wisconsin Technical College System Board or the Wisconsin Technical College Districts.
