## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, a child of an eligible veteran that is between the ages of 17 and 26 may receive 128 credits or 8 semesters of tuition remission at University of Wisconsin System institutions or state technical colleges. This bill reduces the minimum age at which such an individual may receive the tuition remission from 17 to 15 years of age.

## Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The fiscal impact of this bill is indeterminate as there isn't sufficient data to determine which eligible students would choose to utilize the provisions in this bill rather than dual enrollment or early college programs.
