Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Health Services to establish an Office of Violence Prevention. The bill specifies several responsibilities for the office related to coordinating and expanding violence prevention activities, including implementing a grant program for local communities and developing sources of funding to support the office. To create the office, it is estimated that a total of 8.0 FTE will be needed for a total cost of \$591,000 GPR annually.

Staff include a Program Director, an Executive Staff Assistant, two Financial Specialists, two Grants Specialists, and two Program and Policy Analysts. There will be an additional one-time cost of \$20,000 GPR for office setup costs. In addition, the bill directs the office to establish a grant program to support violence reduction in local communities. Costs of the grant program are indeterminate depending on the activities of the office.
