## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates new statutory language prohibiting the Department from requiring a prescription and prior authorization before reimbursing a provider for the repair of complex rehabilitation technology if the complex rehabilitation technology was previously prescribed and reimbursed under Medical Assistance. The new language does not apply to complex rehabilitation technology intended for use by an individual who is enrolled in a managed care organization.

According to s. 49.45(9r)(b), the Department shall promulgate rules and other policies for use of complex rehabilitation technology by recipients of Medical Assistance. Complex rehabilitation technology is defined to mean items classified within Medicare as durable medical equipment that are individually configured for individuals to meet their specific and unique medical, physical, and functional needs and capacities for basic activities of daily living and instrumental activities of daily living identified as medically necessary.

In calendar year 2020, there were 59 complex rehabilitation technology prior authorization requests in Medicaid totaling \$127,300. This equals around \$2,200 per prior authorization request.

The Department anticipates that this bill could increase costs related to complex rehabilitation technology. However, it is not possible to estimate the precise amount of additional Medicaid claims that might be paid under the proposed change. Therefore, the fiscal estimate is indeterminate.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
