### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2023 SB 47 includes notification requirements for a person, including a representative of a developer or other company, seeking to purchase or lease land for the purpose of constructing a large solar electric generating facility. The bill outlines when the notification must be made, who must be notified and what the notification must include.

2023 SB 47 requires persons, 45 days prior to submitting an application to the Public Service Commission (Commission) for a certificate of public convenience and necessity (CPCN) for a large solar electric generating facility, to provide written notification to all political subdivisions located in the proposed facility area indicating an interest in entering into a joint development agreement (JDA). In the following 45 days the bill requires the persons to make a good faith effort to negotiate a JDA with each political subdivision. The JDAs are not required to be executed prior to submitting for the CPCN. Under the bill, the political subdivisions must make a record of its decision-making process regarding the JDA.

2023 SB 47 requires Commission staff to promulgate rules that address topics covered in JDAs at a statewide level. It is anticipated that this work could be absorbed with existing staff resources.

2023 SB 47 will likely have ongoing staff time requirements after rule promulgation. It is anticipated this work could be absorbed with existing staff resources.
