Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, if certain federally chartered youth membership organizations make a request to a public school to be permitted to provide oral and/or information regarding the organization to pupils during a school day on school property, the public school would be required to permit the organization to do so. Specifically, the principal of the public schools would be required to schedule at least one date and time during the beginning of the school term for representatives of the organization to provide information to pupils in the school, on school property.

School districts and independent charter schools would be subject to the requirement created in the bill.

Schools may need to dedicate some staff resources to make arrangements for a representative of the organization to conduct the informational activities on school property. However, this bill is not expected to have a direct fiscal impact on either the state or on public schools.
