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Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the department to create a report on the number of homeless children and youths, as defined in federal law under 42 USC 11434a (2) [McKinney-Vento Act], in the public schools in the state and submit the report to the chief clerk of each house of the Legislature on an annual basis.

The department current collects data that captures a student's housing status. the "Unaccompanied Homeless Youth" data element indicates whether or not homeless children or youth are in physical custody of a parent or legal guardian. This data can be accessed on the WISEdash public portal, beginning with the 2018-19 school year. The data for years prior to 2018-19 is available but not in the public portal.

The requirement to submit a report to the legislature would require the department to do some additional work to produce a report that would be distributed to the chief clerks of each house. However, because this data collection already exists there is no direct fiscal impact at the state or local level.
