Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to provide large metal containers where hunters may dispose of deer carcasses, to be placed in locations throughout the state as determined by DNR. It provides \$1.0 million/yr. of ongoing Fish & Wildlife Account funding for the carcass disposal sites, and \$50,000/yr. of ongoing Fish & Wildlife Account funding to educate hunters about chronic wasting disease and the importance of proper carcass disposal.

I. Background Information

- A. Records from the department's Bureau of Wildlife Management indicate there were 130 dumpsters available during the 2023 9-day gun season. Of those 74 were adopted, 44 were DNR hosted, 3 were private and 9 were listed as other.
- B. There is a limit of 3 cost-share, adopted dumpsters per county. Resource and staffing do not support more than a modest increase from those levels.
- C. There is a limit of 1 DNR-hosted dumpster per eligible county due to resource and staffing constraints.
- D. There is no limit on the number of fully adopted dumpsters (paid for by the partner).
- II. State Fiscal Effect

Expenditures for deer carcass disposal sites and hunter education efforts would be expected to increase by \$1,050,000/yr. to coincide with the additional spending authority provided in the bill.
