**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Senate Bill 960 requires the Wisconsin Department of Justice, in consultation with the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) Board, the Department of Safety and Professional Services and the Cosmetology Examining Board, to identify and establish industry specific materials for use in providing instruction to students in schools of barbering, cosmetology, aesthetics, electrology, or manicuring in the recognition and reporting of human trafficking.

The WTCS Board and Districts will incur minor costs related to the development and delivery of materials on the recognition and reporting of human trafficking. The WTCS Board and Districts may absorb these increased costs.
