Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This proposal requires the Department to establish a Palliative Care Council. Members will include medical and clinical professionals, people with lived experiences receiving palliative care, an insurance company representative, a Department of Health Services representative, and members of the Legislature. The council is required to meet at least twice annually. The proposal recommends that council appointments and meeting locations prioritize geographic diversity. The council is required to submit reports to the Legislature regarding best practices and other matters the council takes up. Additionally, the bill requires the Department to establish a statewide palliative care consumer and professional information and education program. Information and resources regarding palliative care are to be made available on the Department's website.

To coordinate and support the Palliative Care Council, the Department would be responsible for developing consumer and professional education materials, external communications (e.g., a website, and other publications), coordinating between council members and the Legislature, and assisting with meeting logistics. The Department estimates 1.0 FTE would be responsible for communication and education activities and 0.5 FTE would be responsible for coordinating between council members, the Legislature, and meeting logistics. The Department estimates the cost of 1.5 FTE, Program and Policy Analyst Advanced, is \$137,000 GPR annually. The Department estimates that the annual cost of materials, equipment, lodging, meeting space, and other costs will be \$23,800 GPR annually. This estimate is based on costs of meetings for similar committees and councils. The total estimated cost is \$160,800 GPR annually.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
