Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 355 (AB-355) repeals a number of statutes relating to abortion, including certain criminal penalties for performing abortions outside prescribed parameters, and eliminates restrictions on abortion-inducing drugs, insurance coverage, and provider regulations. The bill affirms the right to bodily autonomy and ensures access to abortion services when determined necessary by a medical provider.

The District Attorneys are responsible for prosecuting criminal cases, handling state forfeiture actions and traffic violations, cooperating on welfare fraud investigations, as well as participating in John Doe investigations, attending grand jury proceedings, representing the state in criminal appeals, initiating or appearing in civil actions and special proceedings, and enforcing various legal provisions, as authorized and prescribed under Chapter 978, Wis. Stats.

To the extent AB-355 removes unenforceable or rarely prosecuted statutory provisions and clarifies statutory protections around abortion access, it is not expected to create new prosecutorial responsibilities or significantly alter the volume or complexity of cases referred to or pursued by District Attorneys' offices. Therefore, the District Attorneys do not anticipate a fiscal impact to their operations as a result of this bill.
