Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill expands allowable grant costs to include the construction of school district facilities for the purpose of training students in technical education fields. Additionally, this bill modifies the match requirement to be the amount of the grant, regardless of the funding used for the match, and expands allowable in-kind contributions.

The proposed bill has no fiscal impact to the department. Under the bill, annual grant applications may increase due to the bill's reduction to the match rate for certain types of requests and expansion of eligible in-kind contributions. The department assumes the ongoing staff time related to application review and technical assistance will remain status quo.

The new grant eligibility conditions proposed in the bill could result in local school districts that have not yet participated in the program applying for a grant, resulting in increased costs for their district. However, the fiscal effect for these school districts is indeterminate at this time.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
