Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill 84 (AB-84) creates a \$5,000 surcharge for individuals convicted of offenses related to prostitution, including patronizing or soliciting prostitutes, pandering, operating a prostitution venue, or soliciting children for prostitution.

The District Attorneys are responsible for prosecuting criminal cases, handling state forfeiture actions and traffic violations, cooperating on welfare fraud investigations, as well as participating in John Doe investigations, attending grand jury proceedings, representing the state in criminal appeals, initiating or appearing in civil actions and special proceedings, and enforcing various legal provisions, as authorized and prescribed under Chapter 978 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

As this bill only poses a new penalty which is not administered by the District Attorneys, and as there are no new or modified prosecutorial functions that would result from AB-84, there is no anticipated change to the District Attorneys' caseloads or operations. Therefore, the District Attorneys do not anticipate a fiscal impact to its operations.
