Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill exempts amusement rides located at campgrounds licensed by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) from regulation by the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) if they are installed according to the manufacturer's recommended standards.

DSPS currently defines amusement rides and is empowered to perform inspections of all classes of amusement rides. DATCP is entrusted with the legislative authority under ATCP 79.23 to inspect play equipment, such as swings, merry-go-rounds, and jungle gyms. The scope of DATCP's inspections is limited to safety checks, including sharp edges, protruding bolt ends, and open S-hooks. The inspections performed by both agencies are distinctive and do not duplicate one another.

The proposed bill references Wisconsin Statutes Chapter 97.67, recreational sanitation, which is the only identifiable linkage to DATCP in the bill. The bill does not require DATCP to perform any specific action. Thus, DATCP expects no attributable cost to the department with respect to the bill.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

There is currently no long-range fiscal implication for this bill. However, if the department is compelled to perform additional inspections in the future similar to those currently performed by DSPS, DATCP would expect to have similar costs as DSPS currently has and need additional budget authority.
